Dr. Robert Prentiss Daniel is most known for his contributions to educational and Black psychology. His most notable work included the psychological study of African-American male

children, in which he created measures to understand perceived differences in personality traits and characteristics of problem behavior. During this time, he was also

elected the President of Shaw University in North Carolina. He was active in advocating for the betterment of Black schools.
