h.D. Psychology, Fordham University Dr. Amos N. Wilson worked not only as a psychologist, but as a social caseworker, supervising probation officer, professor at City University of New York and as a training administrator in the New York City Department of Juvenile Justice. He was

against the foundation and agenda of equal education because he felt that it could not meet the needs of students of different racial backgrounds. He encouraged African Americans to reclaim their heritage and culture and to stay

away from integration. His publications include Development of the Black Child, Understanding Black Adolescent Male Violence: Its Remediation and Preventions, and Awakening the Natural Genius of Black Children.
