Courses Taught at UMBC

- PSYC331: *Experimental Psychology: Design and Analysis I.* Design and analysis of single-variable experiments and quasi-experiments. This course emphasizes the design, analysis, interpretation and evaluation of psychological research.
- PSYC332: *Experimental Psychology: Design and Analysis II*. Design and analysis of experiments, including multi-factor problems. Students perform experiments, apply statistical methods in data analysis and write scientific reports.
- PSYC493: Seminar in Quantitative Methods: Multiple Regression. Application and use of multiple regression in Psychological research. Students receive extensive theoretical and applied training in the use and interpretation of multiple regression.

- PSYC611: *Data Analytic Procedures I*. The purpose of the course is to train students in the theory and uses of simple and complex analyses of variance and in the uses of multiple regression analyses as a hypothesis-testing procedure.

 (Including associated lab focusing on estimation of the analyses using two statistical software packages; SAS and SPSS)
- PSYC711: *Data Analytic Procedures II*. Applications of multivariate methods of data analysis in psychological research. Topics include multi-variate descriptive statistics, multi-variate multiple regression, multi-variate analysis of variance and covariance and factor analysis. (Including associated lab focusing on estimation of the analyses using two statistical software packages; SAS and SPSS)
- PSYC713: Longitudinal Data Analysis. The focus of this course is on the understanding and application of analytical techniques that are alternatives to the Repeated Measures ANOVA model when working with data arising from longitudinal designs; Latent Growth Curve modeling (LGC) and Individual Growth Curve analysis (IGC). This course focuses on the ability to distinguish and choose between the techniques, to understand strengths and weaknesses of the techniques, to critically read research using the techniques, and to apply both of these techniques to your own research.
