Ph.D. Educational Psychology, 1940 Columbia University Dr. Kenneth Bancroft Clark was the first African American to earn a PhD at Columbia University, earn a tenured professorship at the City College of New York, join the NY State Board of Regents and serve as president of the American Psychological Association. His books include "Prejudice and Your Child," "Dark Ghetto," "A Possible Reality," and "Pathos of Power". Kenneth B. Clark and his wife, Mamie Phipps Clark conducted experiments on racial biases in education.
Their findings were cited in the
Supreme Court decision on
Brown v. Board of Education of
Topeka, Kansas ruling public
school segregation
unconstitutional.
