

Keturah Elisabeth Whitehurst, Ph.D.

1912 - 2000

Ph.D. Developmental and Experimental Psychology, 1952 Harvard University Prior to receiving her PhD from what is now known as Harvard University in 1952, Dr. Keturah Elisabeth Whitehurst worked as the head of the English Department at Albany State College in Georgia. She was the first African-American woman

to intern at Harvard's
Psychological Clinic. She then
joined Virginia State College's
faculty. Dr. Whitehurst took a
position at the University of
Nashville, where she taught
psychology and established the
Fisk Children's School. She also

published research on cultural factors that influence the development of African-American children.
