

Robert V. Guthrie, Ph.D.

Ph.D. Psychology, 1970 United States International University Dr. Robert V. Guthrie is best known for Even the Rat Was White: A Historical View of Psychology, which exposed the history of racism in Psychology and documented the valuable contributions of Black psychologists. When Robert

Guthrie returned to academic life after serving in the desecrated military he was struck by the lack of welcome, and support he encountered. In 1968 he and his colleagues founded the Association of Black Psychologists. In 2001, he

became the first African-American to have his papers included in the National Archives of Psychology in Akron, Ohio. It is thanks to his profiles of Black psychologists that the work of these pioneers has been remembered.
